
Future Generations Act Report 2025 -


Commissioned Body Art on Climate and Nature | National Museum Cardiff | 2025


I was commissioned to create a body art piece in response to the Future Generations Act Report 2025, with a focus on the report's key themes and recommendations surrounding climate and nature. The artwork visually interpreted urgent issues such as environmental degradation, sustainability, and intergenerational responsibility.

This piece was officially exhibited at the National Museum Cardiff during the launch of the report, serving as a powerful visual companion to the policy discussions and public engagement. The image is also featured in the report itself—published on page 46 under the section Recommendations on Climate and Nature—highlighting the role of art in amplifying climate messaging and policy awareness.

This commission reflects my continued commitment to using body art as a medium for advocacy, policy engagement, and cultural storytelling within the climate justice movement.







The Good Ancestor Project -

Commissioned Climate Change Artworks | Cardiff | 2025

Commissioned by the Sub-Sahara Advisory Panel (SSAP), I created two original body art pieces for The Good Ancestor Project—an initiative aimed at raising awareness about climate change and our collective responsibility to future generations. Developed in partnership with the RSPB (Royal Society for the Protection of Birds), the project highlights the urgent need to protect nature and wildlife.

My artworks explore the deep interconnection between humans, nature, and wildlife, conveying the message that none can thrive in isolation. Through powerful visual storytelling, each piece reflects themes of environmental stewardship, biodiversity, and the delicate balance required for ecological survival.

These artworks are exhibited on billboards, bus stops and in public spaces across Cardiff, engaging communities directly and sparking dialogue around climate justice, conservation, and the legacy we leave behind. This project exemplifies how art can serve as a bridge between grassroots action, policy, and public awareness.

Prayer Day Commissioned Artwork Exhibition | Heywood Civic Centre | 2025

Commissioned by Culture Coop, my artwork titled Prayer Day is currently exhibited at the entrance to Heywood Civic Centre as part of the People's Outdoor Gallery—a public art initiative celebrating creativity and cultural expression in community spaces. Launched on 28th January 2025 in Manchester, the project transforms everyday public areas into vibrant open-air galleries, making art accessible to all.

Prayer Day is a reflective piece that invites viewers to pause, connect, and contemplate themes of spirituality, resilience, and communal hope. Positioned at a key entry point, the artwork serves as a powerful visual welcome and encourages deeper engagement with art in daily life.


Commissioned for Manchester Town of Culture, Outdoor Gallery | Manchester | 2025









Wales-Africa Celebration
